# The Sunday Gospel: Matthew 10:26-33

When this gospel was written, Christians are being persecuted by the Jews. And Jesus has predicted that the disciples will face difficulties in their mission. Many people will not receive them well. Even family members will turn away from them because of their commitment to Jesus and the kingdom. Today's Gospel offers the disciples consolation against this difficult truth and is certainly intended to strengthen these early Christians. And if we are believers today, it is because they stood firm and overcame their initial fears. Here Jesus might be understood as putting suffering in perspective. The followers of Jesus are called upon to keep their focus on God. Those who can harm the body do not have ultimate power because they cannot destroy the soul. Still persecution and suffering cannot be avoided or prevented. But Jesus reassures his followers that God knows and cares about what happens to his children. We might not face the same type of persecution, but we do experience difficulties as we endeavor to live a Christian life. We need the reminder that what God thinks about us is more important. We are reassured by the promise that God cares for us and protects us. Jesus invites us to trust as he reminds us that we remain in God's hand.

However; due to COVID-19, churches must follow strict protocols at each Mass ensuring that the coronavirus does not spread among the people. As a result of these restrictions, Our Lady of Mercy Parish will continue to operate on its winter schedule 9:00 AM Mass at Port Severn & 11:00 AM Mass at Honey Harbour. There will be NO Saturday evening Mass in Port Severn.

# Important Reminders During Fandemic

**Pray always.** Stay at home as much as possible. Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly. Observe physical distance. Wear a face mask or face shield when physical distancing is not possible. Connect with others virtually. Say "thank you" to frontline staff and community workers.

Self Care Check-up: Have you taken your temperature at home? Is your temperature normal? Are you experiencing any of the following symptoms- coughing and wheezing, fatigue, loss of appetite, shortness of breath, excessive sputum, aching muscles, headaches, chills, confusion, runny nose and/or shaking? Have you been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19? Have you been out of the country or the province? If yes, did you observe the mandatory 14-day quarantine upon your return? Are you awaiting test results from your own COVID-19 test?

If the priest has an elevated temperature, he should not celebrate Mass. In addition to temperature, other potential symptoms of viral contagion include, coughing and wheezing, fatigue, loss of appetite, shortage of breath, excessive sputum, aching muscles, headaches, chills, confusion, runny nose, shaking.
